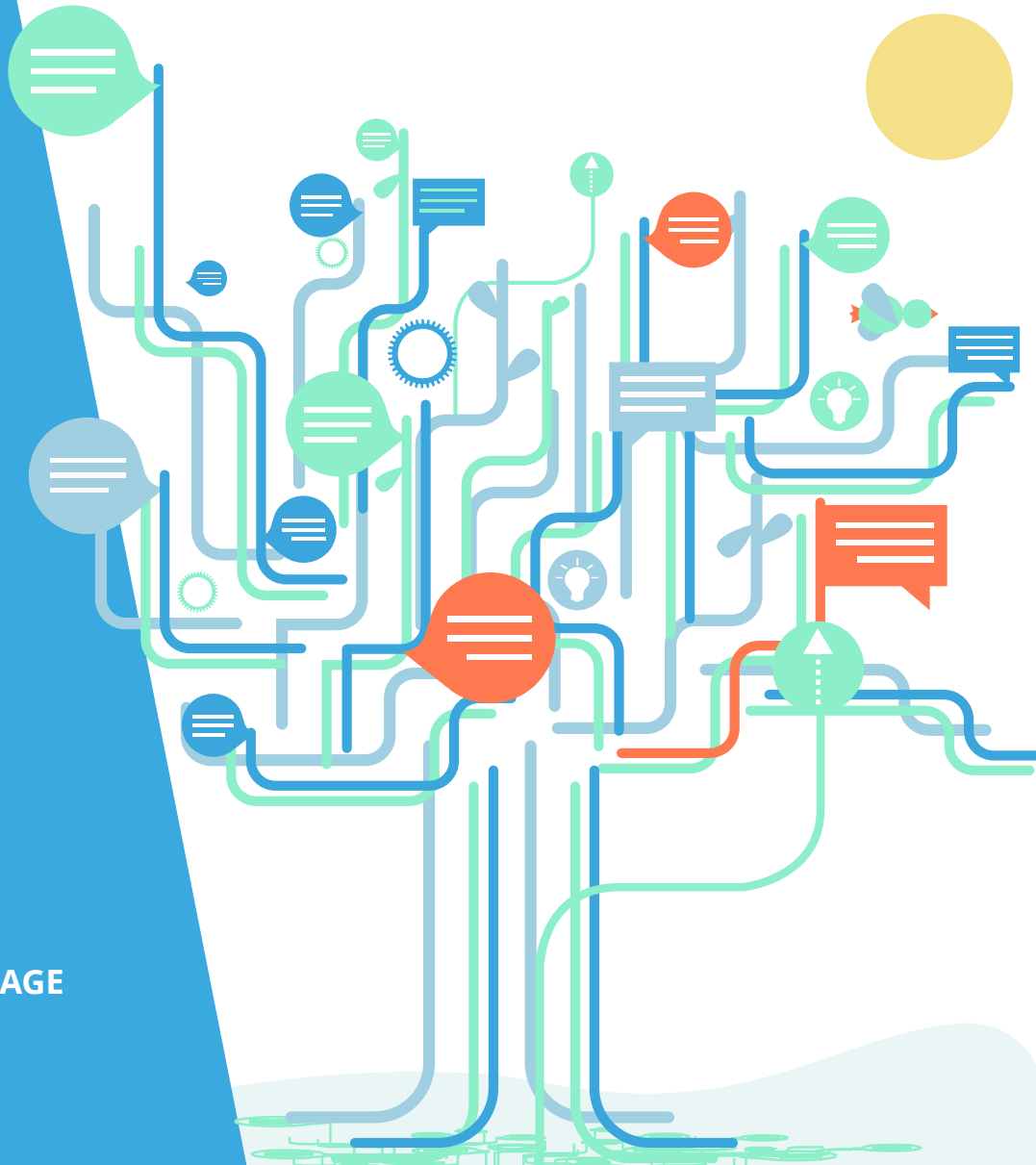

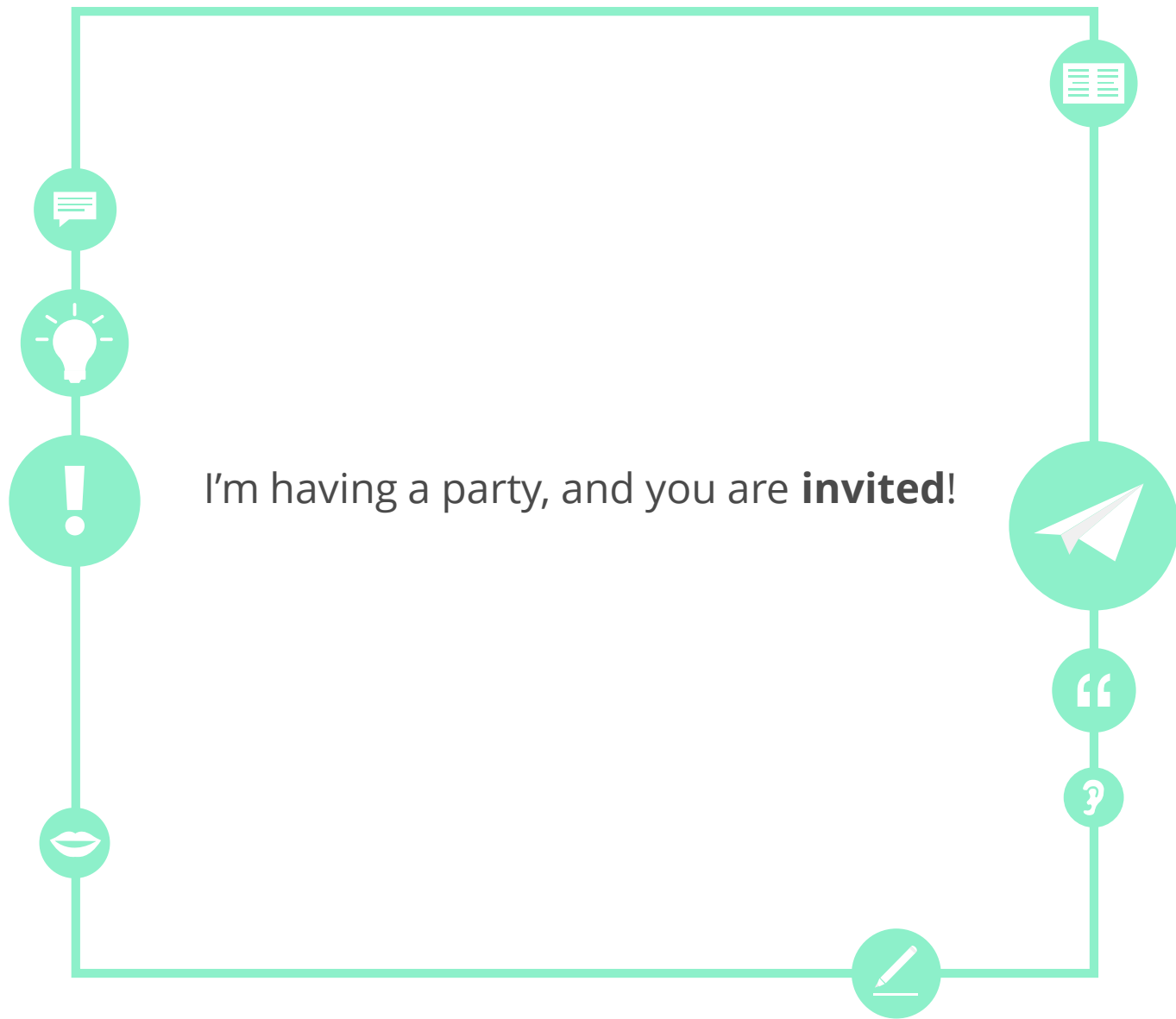

The past simple often ends with **-ed**.

This ending can produce some different sounds. For words that end with a **t** or a **d** the **-ed** ending is pronounced as an **extra syllable**.
