





The success of black comedy and satire exposes the ability of humans to laugh in even the most inappropriate or unfortunate circumstances. It seems that no topic is **off limits** in comedies, from discussions of death, through to religion and faith, and even, in some cases, nuclear war in TV shows and films. Moreover, satire, particularly of politics and political figures, is only gaining in popularity in the twenty-first century.













Black comedies give us an easy way to explore and discuss otherwise taboo issues. They are not only there to make us laugh, but their purpose is to make us think too. Sometimes, we have to laugh to **stave off** complete despair. Approaching an issue such as impending nuclear war with humour allows for a huge relief of stress. Finding a way to bring humour into serious events **lessens the blow**, which is why people are often seen laughing at funerals.





Satire is a type of humour which is designed to expose stupidity or vice in humans, and satire can be directed at individuals, a whole country, or even the world. It often employs the techniques of irony, sarcasm, ridicule and exaggeration.

Like with black comedies, the purpose of satire is to make us laugh, make us think, and possibly even further, to make a change in the world. Satire intends to warn the audience of what the author perceives as corruption in society, in the hope that society will rise **up** and bring change.
