

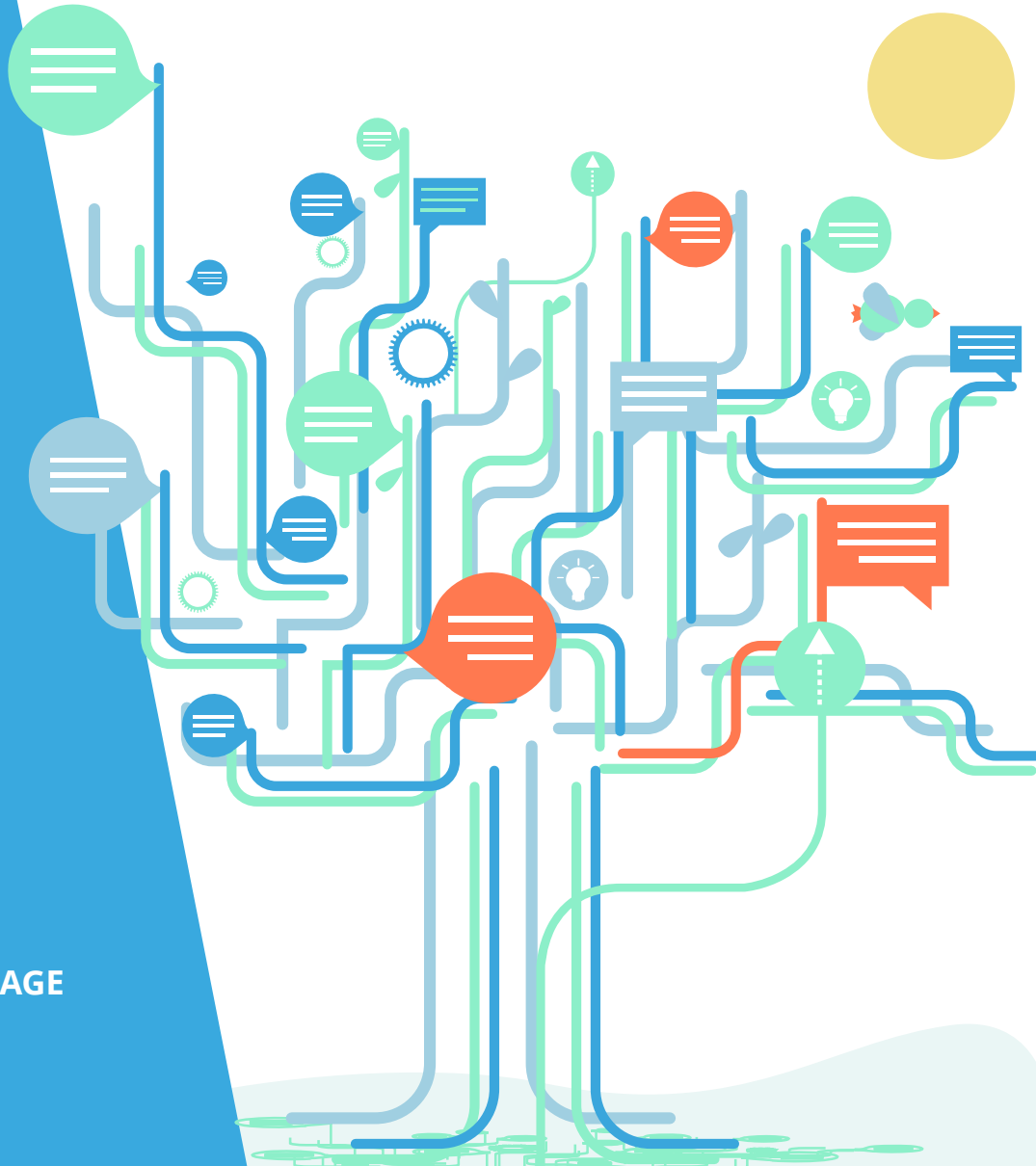

## Plural nouns

- Use **plural nouns** to talk about more than one thing.
- Add **s** to nouns to form plurals.

Singular noun	Plural noun
one <b>language</b>	two <b>languages</b>
one <b>sister</b>	two <b>sisters</b>
one <b>book</b>	two <b>books</b>
