

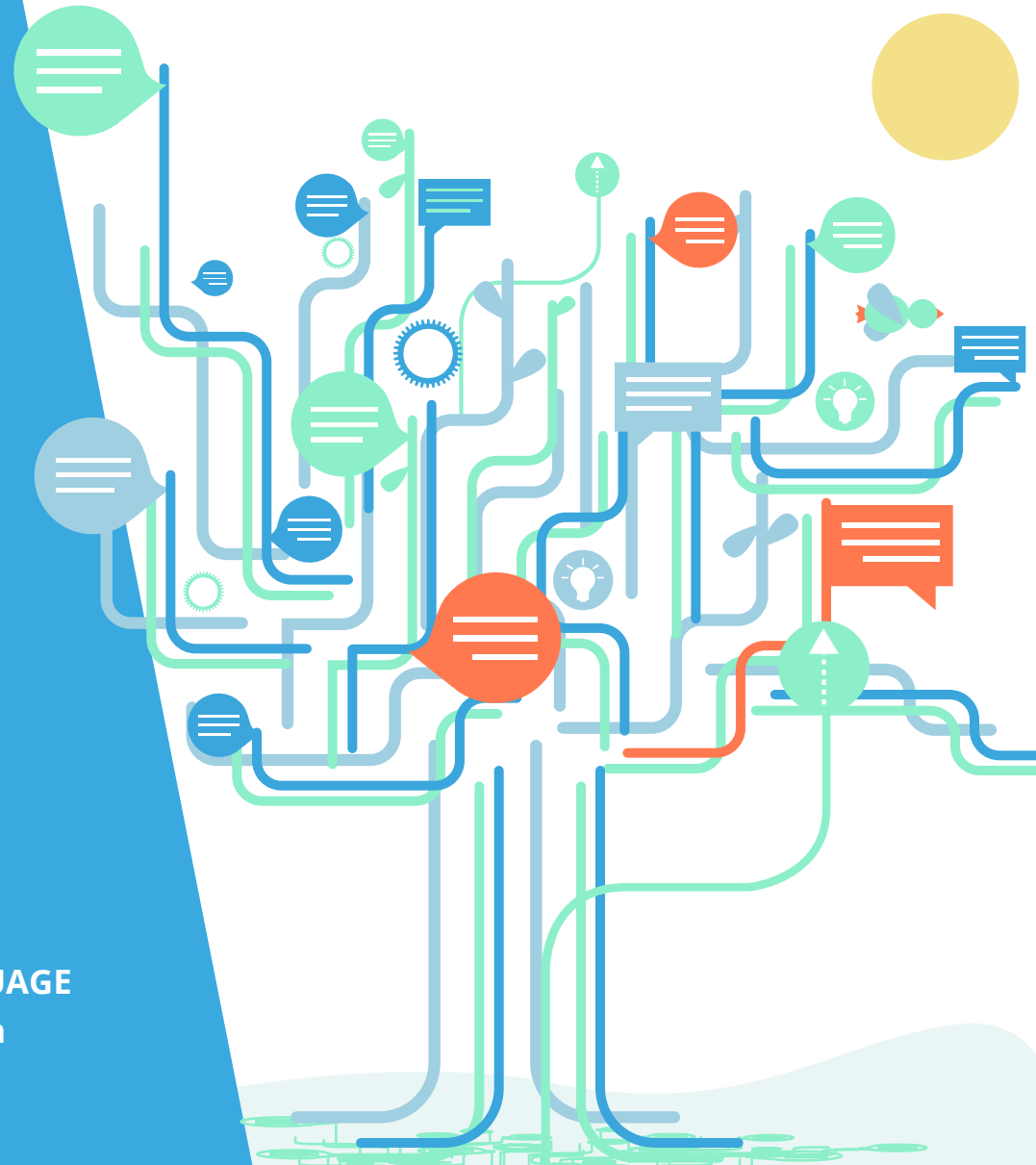

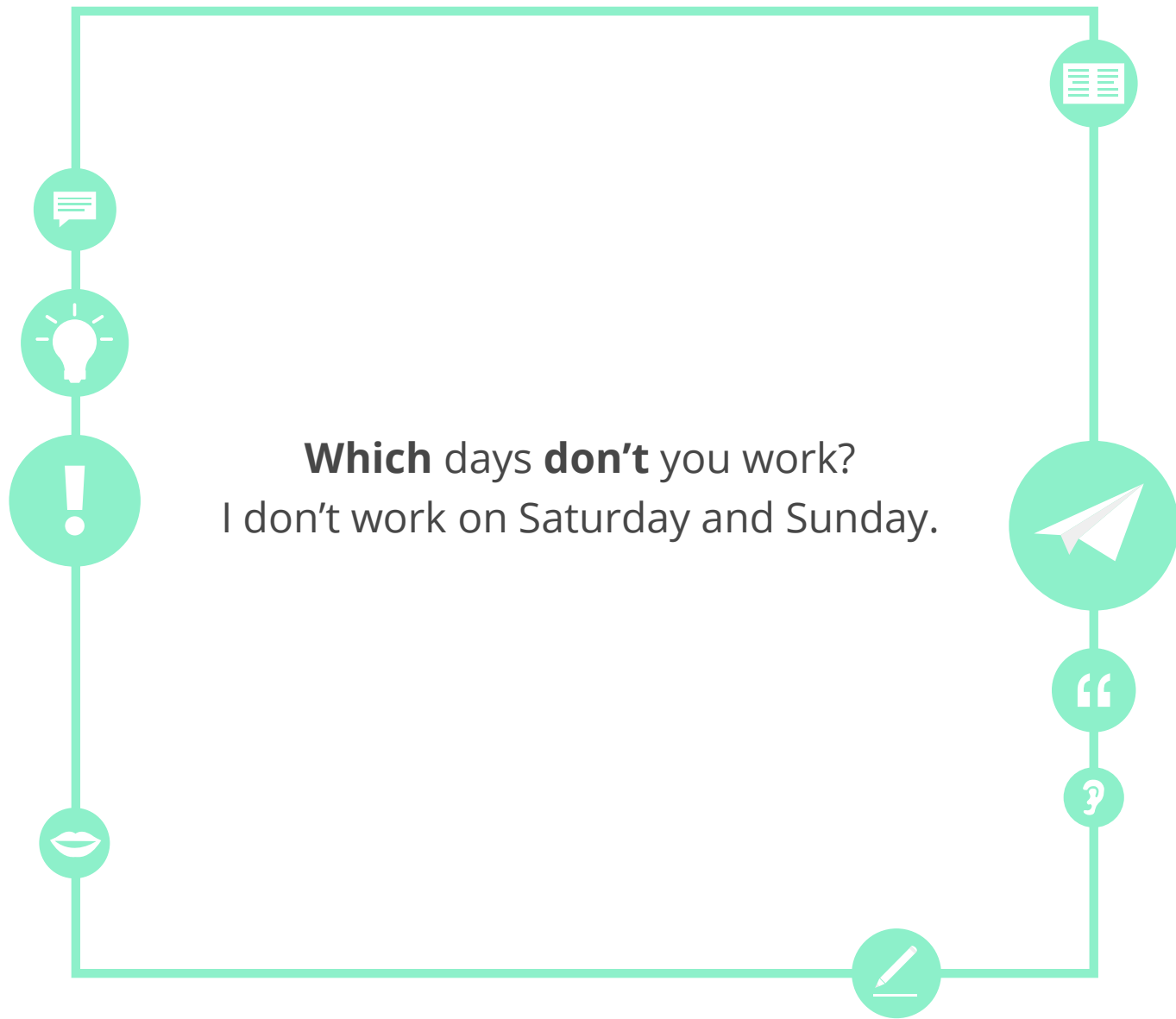




Goals

- Can correctly form questions with 'do' and 'don't'.
- Can differentiate between when to use the 'do' construction and when to use inversion when forming questions.





Which days **don't** you work?
I don't work on Saturday and Sunday.

doctor



A **doctor** helps sick people.

teacher



A **teacher** helps people learn.

hospital



A doctor works at a **hospital**.

school



A teacher works in a **school**.



Where are they?



Sick people go to the **hospital**.

People learn English at **school**.





Where do they work?



Who works in a **hospital**?

A **doctor** works in a **hospital**.



Who works in a **school**?

A **teacher** works in a **school**.





Isn't and aren't

- We use **isn't** and **aren't** in **be** - questions.
 - **is not = isn't**
 - **are not = aren't**

Questions	Answers
Who is a doctor?	I am a doctor.
Who isn't a doctor?	You are not a doctor.
Who is a teacher?	You are a teacher.
Who isn't a teacher?	I am not a teacher.



Don't and doesn't

- We use **don't** and **doesn't** in **do-** questions.
 - **do not = don't**
 - **does not = doesn't**

Questions	Answers
When do you drive to work?	I drive to work when traffic is light.
When don't you drive to work?	I don't drive to work when traffic is heavy.
Where does Kim live?	Kim lives in Switzerland.
Where doesn't Kim live?	Kim doesn't live in Germany.

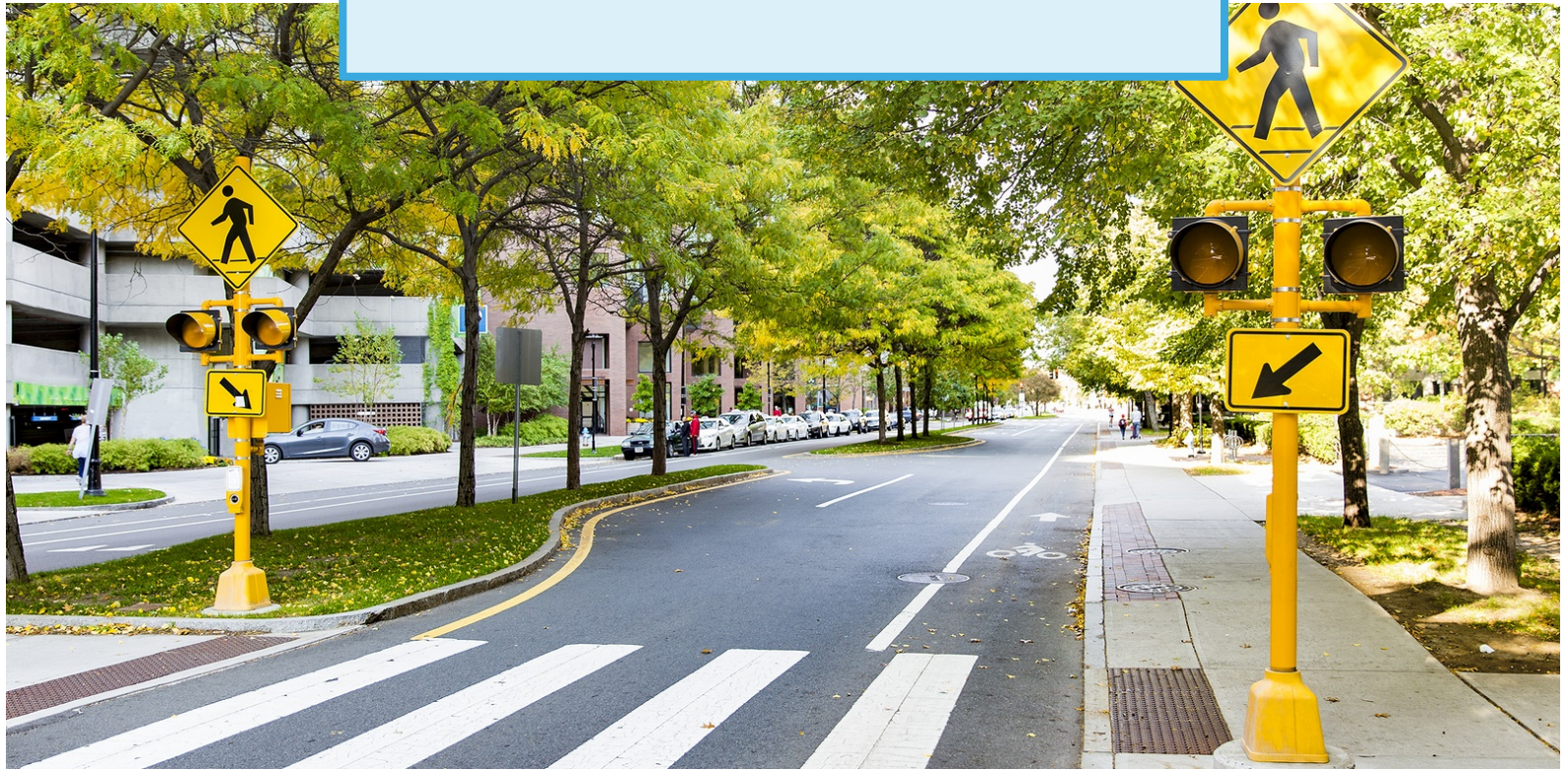

I ride my bike to work when **traffic is light.**

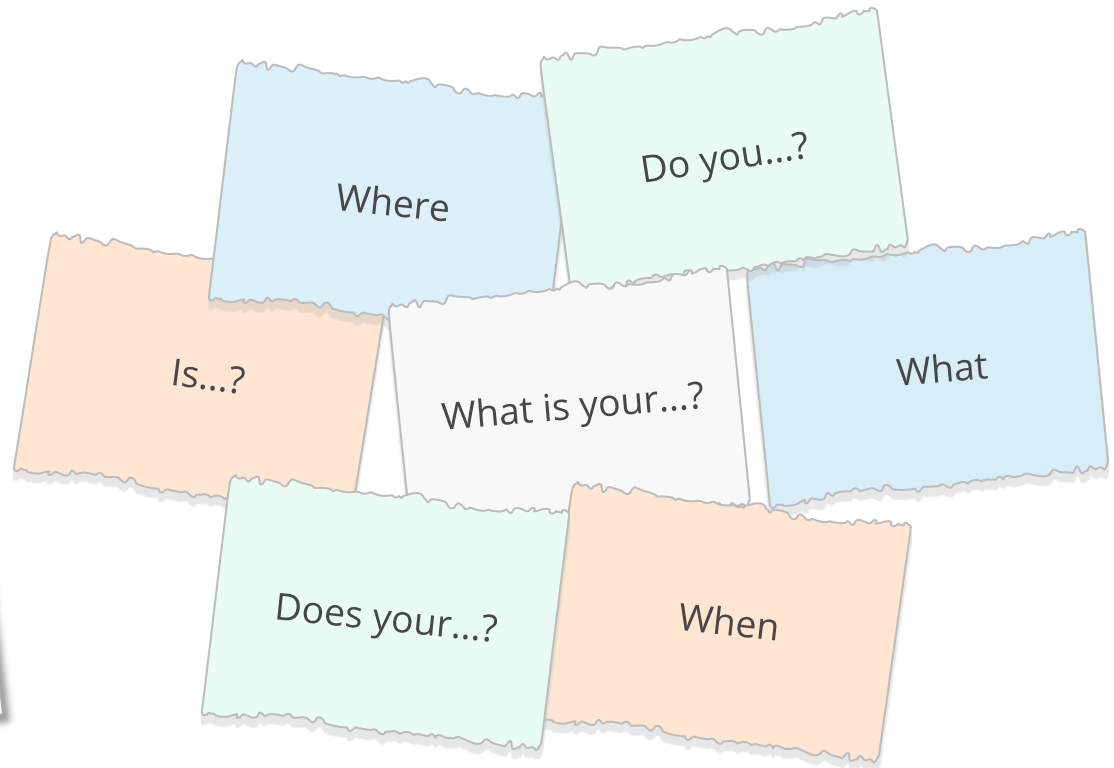

	Questions	Short questions
I take the underground.	When do you take the underground?	When?
I am a doctor.	Where are you a doctor?	Where?
I don't drive a car.	Why don't you drive a car?	Why?
I don't work some days.	Which days don't you work?	Which days?



Short answers

We can give short answers.

Questions	Answers	Short answers
Who is a doctor?	I am a doctor.	I am.
Who isn't a doctor?	She isn't a doctor.	She isn't.
What do you drive?	I drive a car .	A car.
What don't you drive?	I don't drive a taxi .	A taxi.

- **Why + do/does + not + subject**

See the examples below:

Situation	Suggestion
Mary looks tired	Why don't you go to bed?
Alice looks sick	Why don't you go to the doctor?
Mark says he is hungry	Why don't you eat something?
Julia wants to see you	Why don't we meet at the restaurant?
