

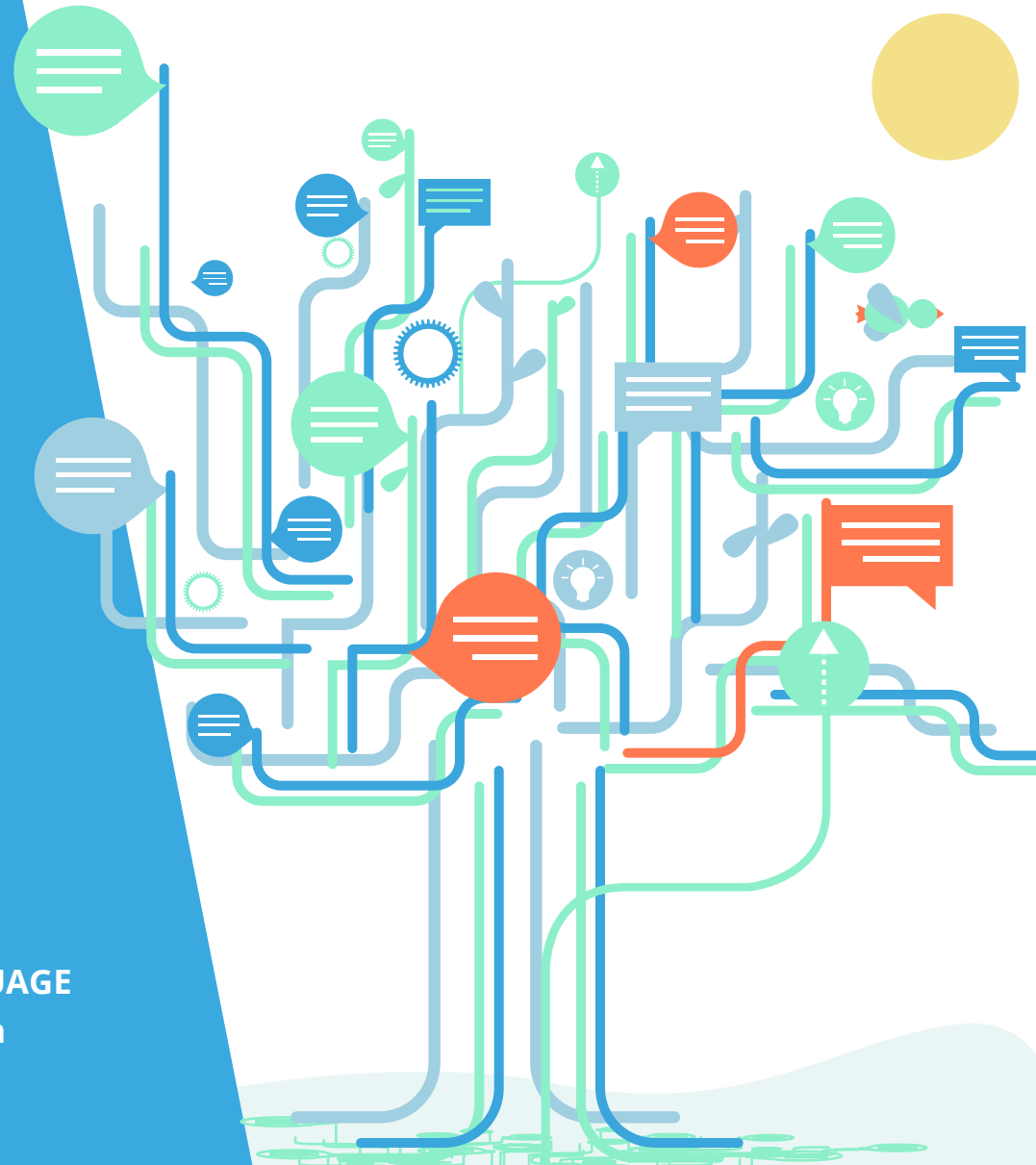

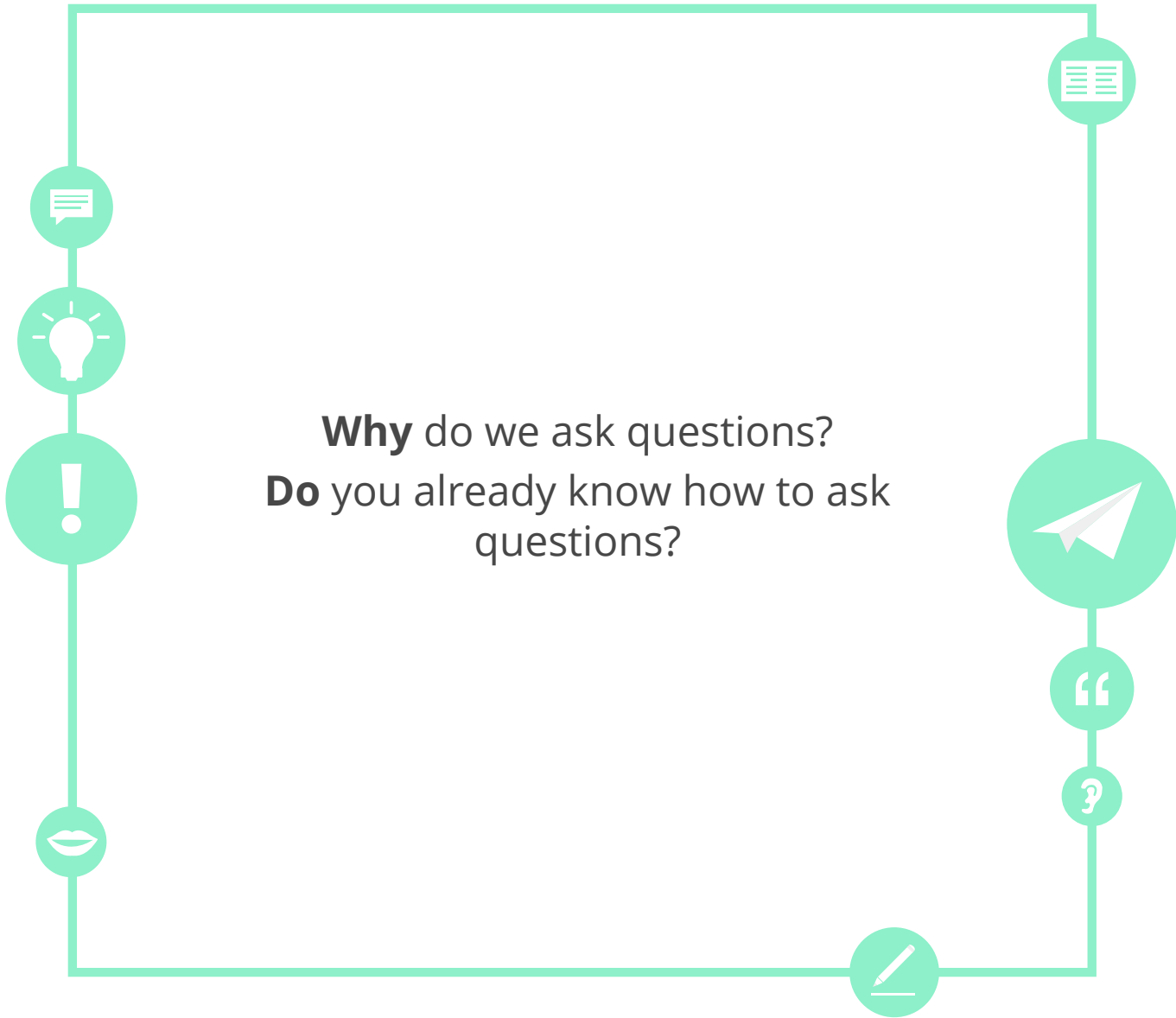


Goals

Why do we ask questions?
Do you already know how to ask questions?





Yes/no questions

We ask questions when we want answers!

We ask different types of questions depending on what information we want.

Sample Questions	Sample Answers
What is your name?	My name is Eric.
Where do you come from?	I come from England.
When do you finish work?	I finish work at 6.00 am.
Do you want to go for a drink?	No.
Are you married?	Yes.
Who is that?	That's my wife.

Questions with *to do*

Many questions in English are formed with the verb **to do**. It is conjugated and the other verb in the question remains in the infinitive form (without the word **to**).

Questions that begin with the verb **to do** are often answerable with **yes** or **no**.

yes/no questions with <i>to do</i>	yes/no answers
Do I have time for a nap?	Yes , go ahead.
Do you like cheesecake?	No , I'm allergic to dairy.
Does he always speak so loudly?	Yes , unfortunately.
Do we need anything from the shop?	No , I already did the shopping.
Do they eat meat?	No , they're vegetarians.



Wh- questions with *to do*

We combine **wh-** question words with the verb **to do** to ask for specific information.

- The answers to these questions are usually complete sentences.
- They often repeat the other verb from the question.

Wh- questions	Answers
Who do you eat lunch with?	I eat lunch with my friends.
Where does he live?	He lives in Paris.
Why does she never clean?	Because she is lazy.
When do you read?	I read on Sundays.
How much does she pay for rent?	She pays €400 per month.



Wh- questions with *to be*

We use the verb **to be** when asking questions in the present continuous tense. We can form questions like this to:

- Talk about things happening right now
- Talk about things that are going to happen

wh- questions with to be	specific answers
Who are you talking to?	I am talking to my landlord.
Which shirt is he wearing?	He is wearing his blue shirt.
Where are you going?	I' m going home.
What are they doing tomorrow?	They are playing football tomorrow.
Why is it raining so much?	It is raining because we are in Ireland!

Other questions with *to be*

We also use the verb **to be** to ask questions about the essence of something, i.e. its colour, size, condition, state, location or owner.

wh- questions with to be	specific answers
What colour is her hair?	Her hair is blonde.
What size is his shirt?	His shirt is a medium.
How is your daughter?	She is fine, thank you.
What time is it?	It is half past two.
Where are my gloves?	They are on the table.
Which bike is yours?	The one with the basket is mine!
