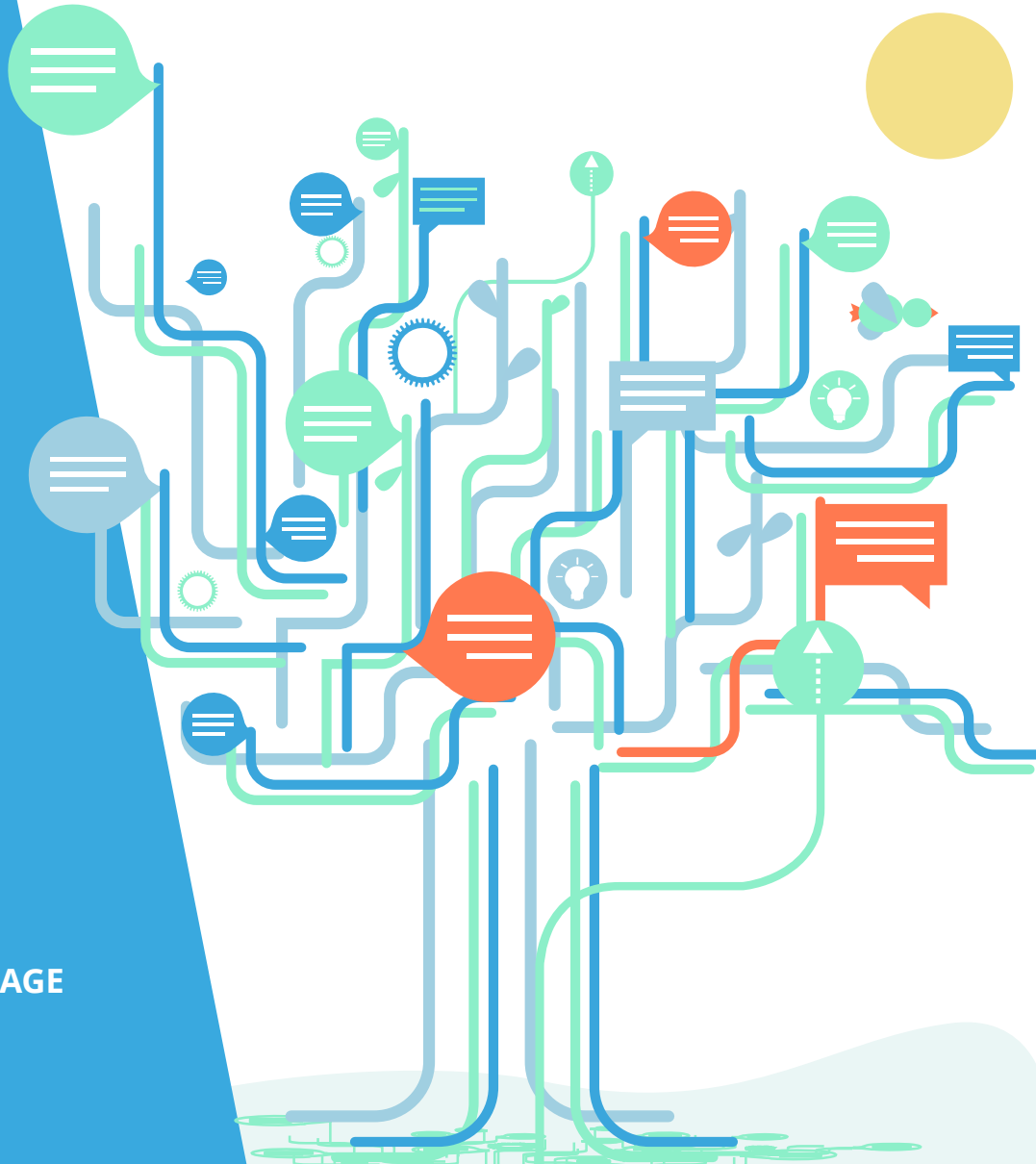

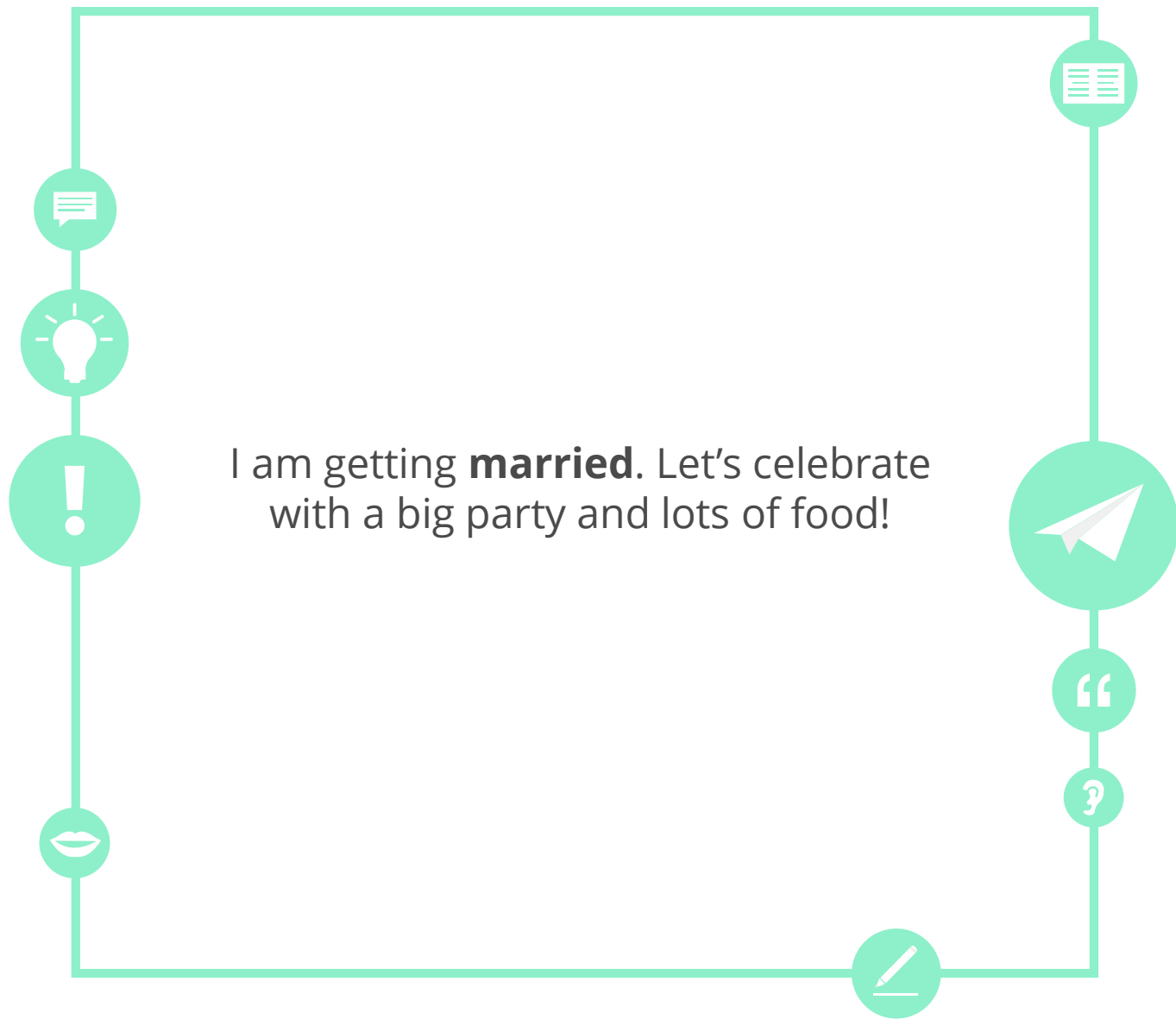




Goals

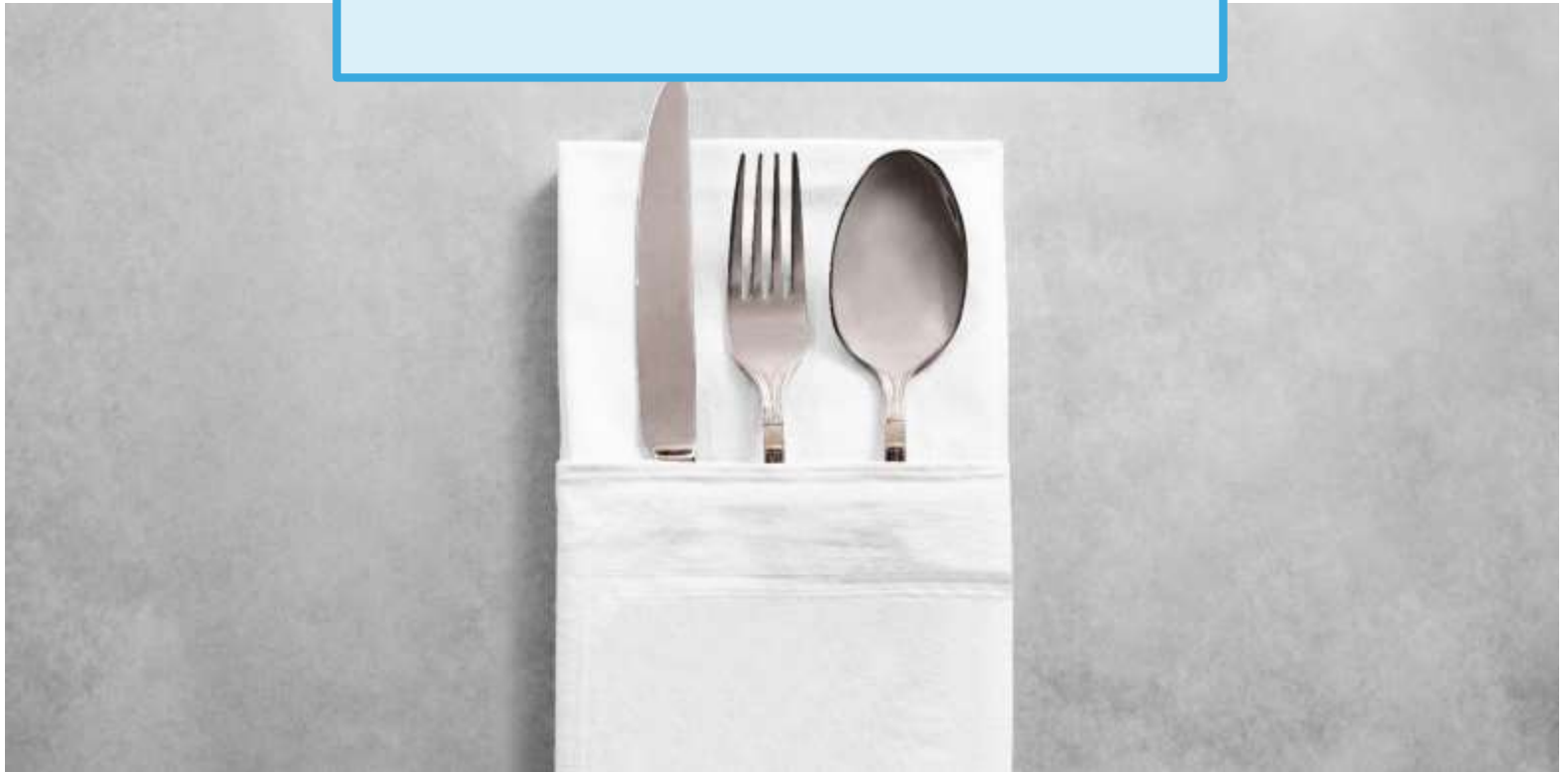
