

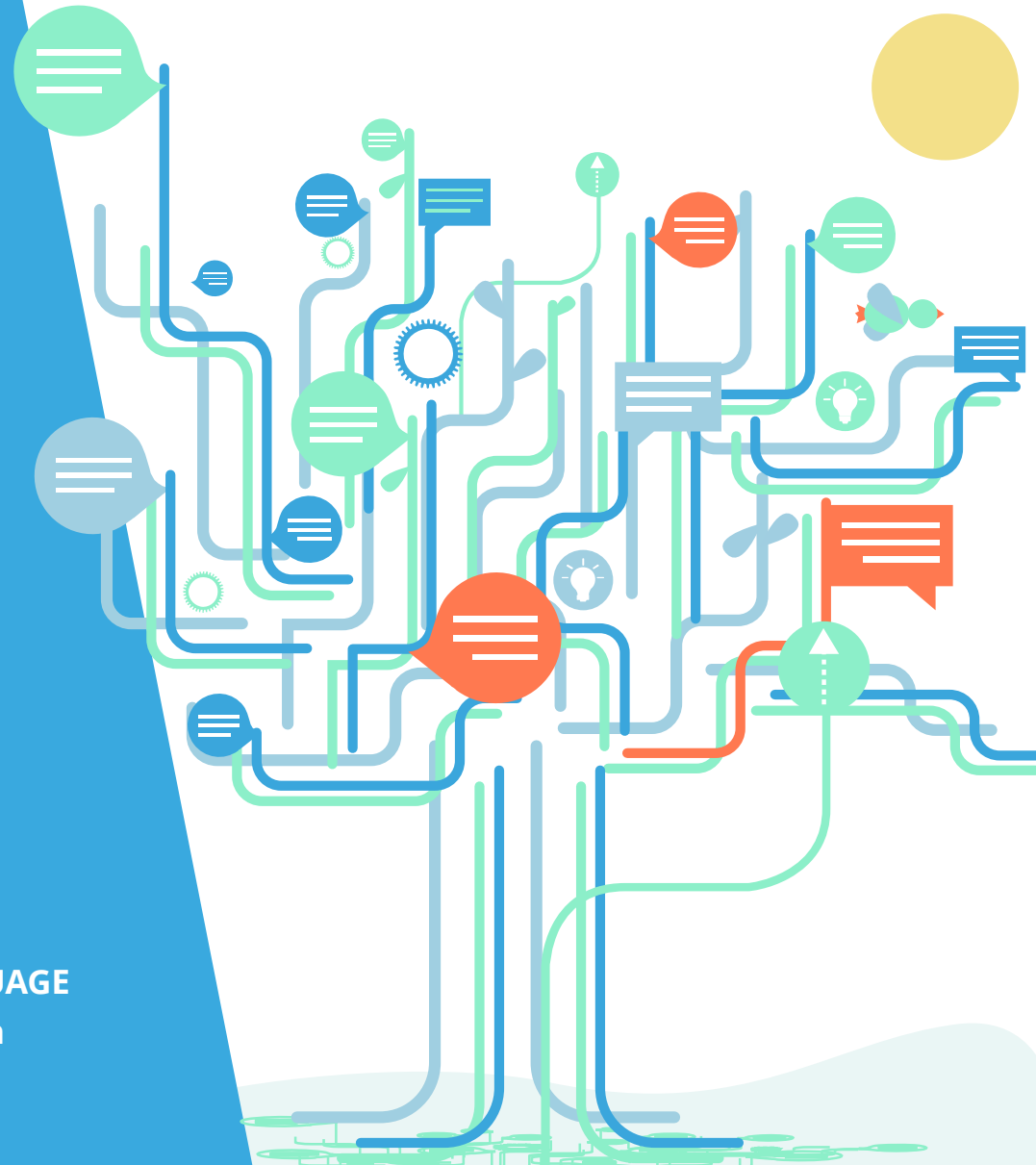

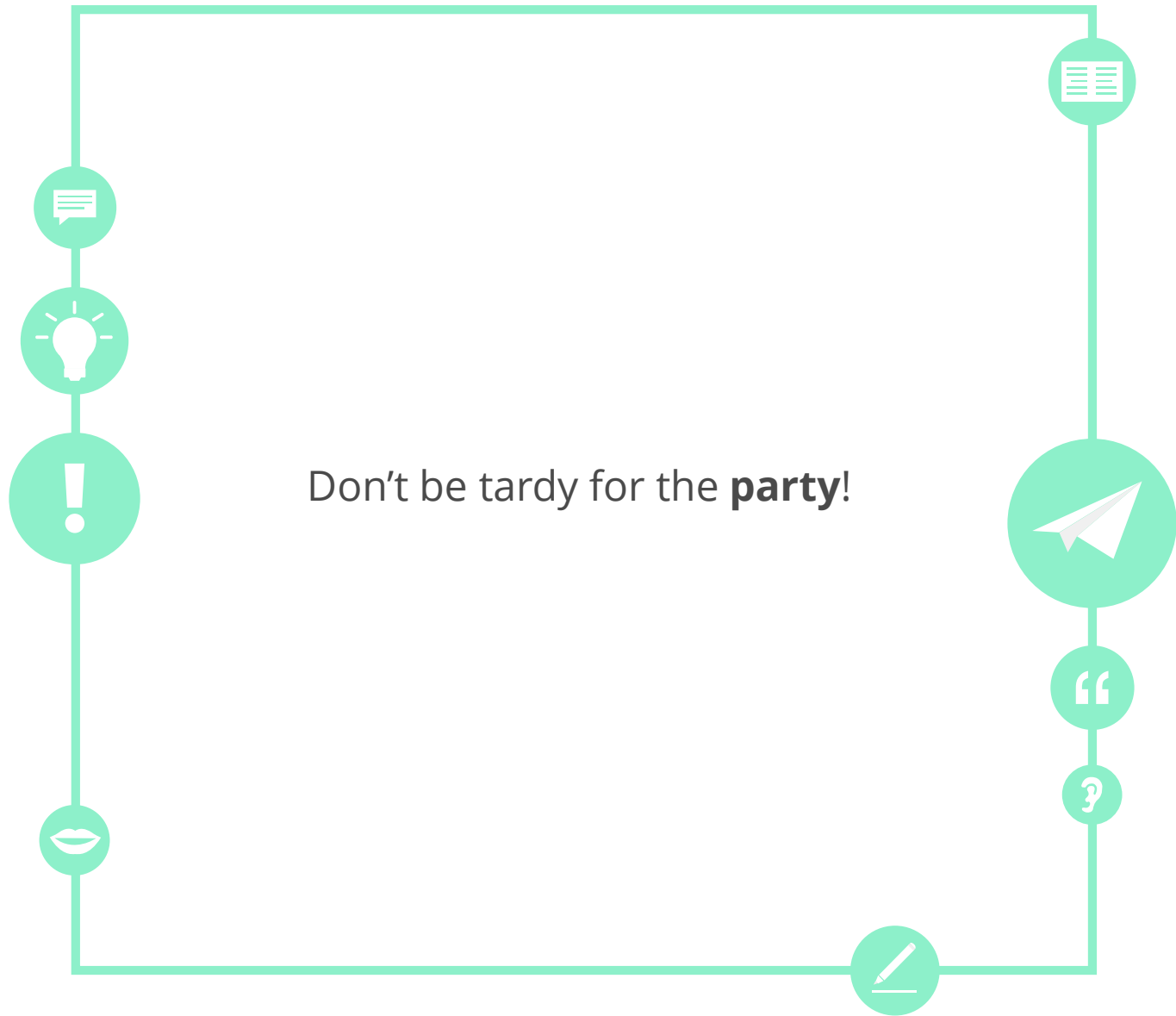




Goals

Did you set a **date** for your wedding?



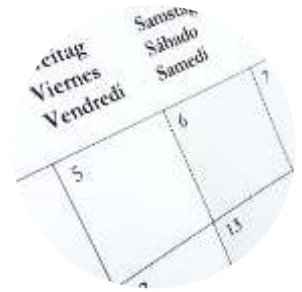

Review of polite questions

Ask questions politely using **could**, **would**, or **can**. Remember to say **please**!

Statement	Polite Question
Reply to my invitation.	Could you please reply to my invitation?
Bring a snack or drink.	Can you please bring a snack or a drink?
Call me.	Would you call me please?

To tell people details about an event, remember to use **at** for times and places, and **on** for specific days.
