

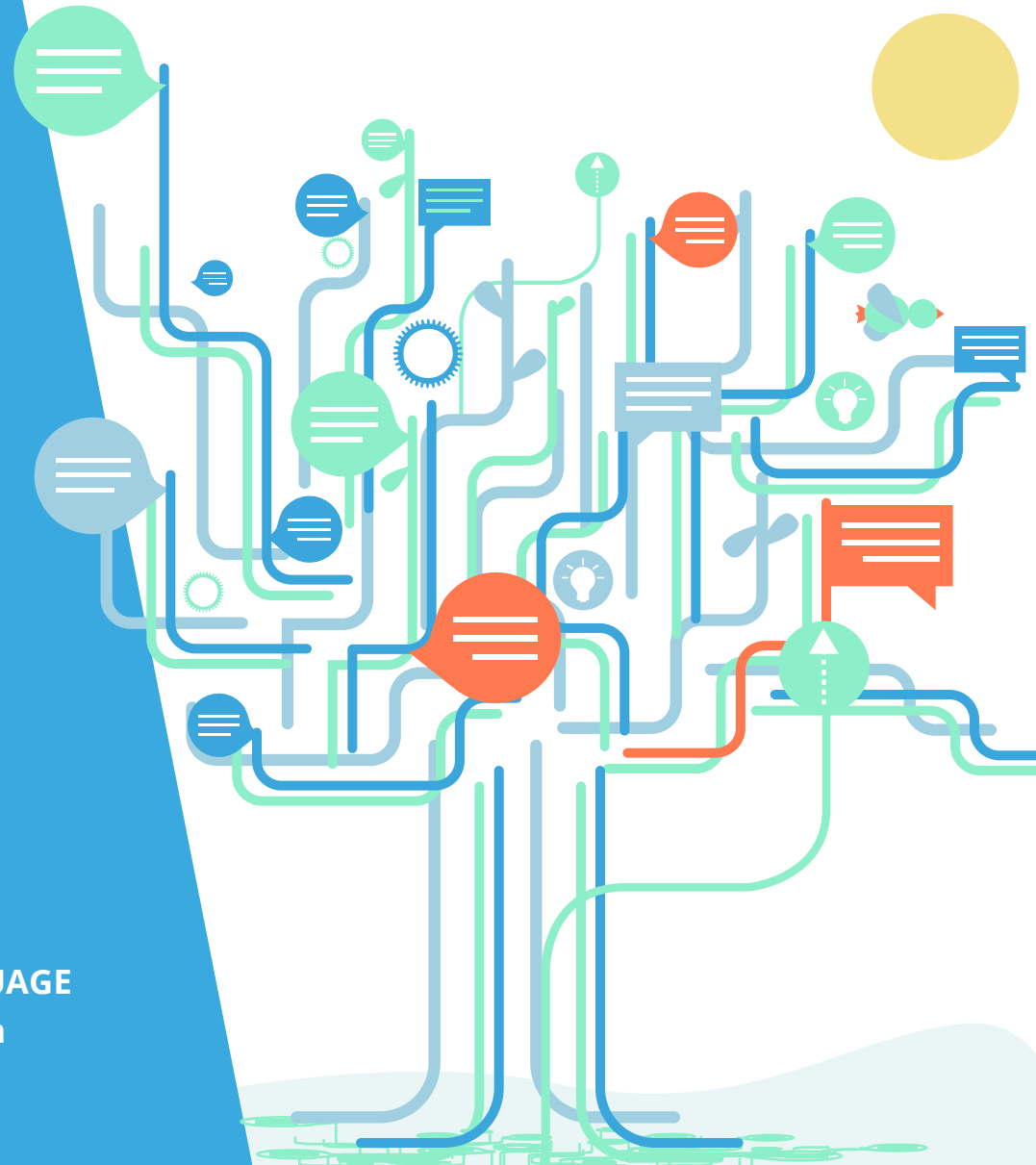






## Goals

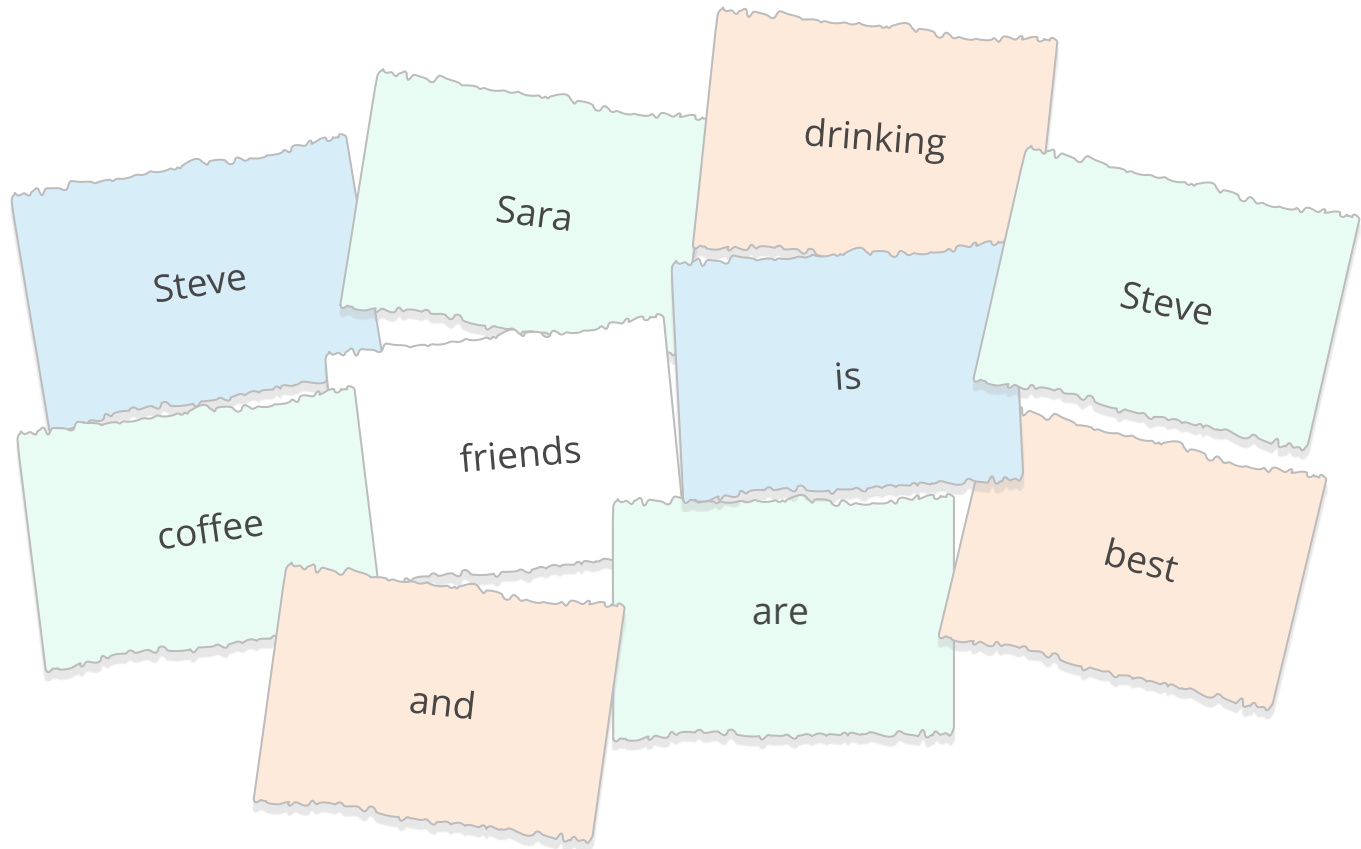

“What does she like to do?” asks Steve.

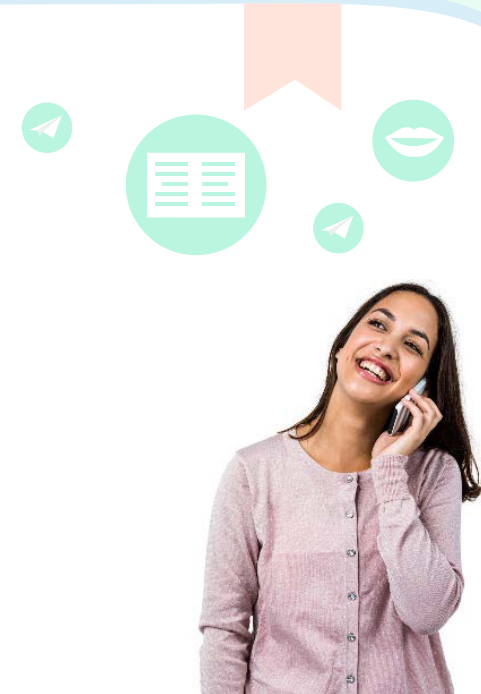
“She likes to go to the movies.”
