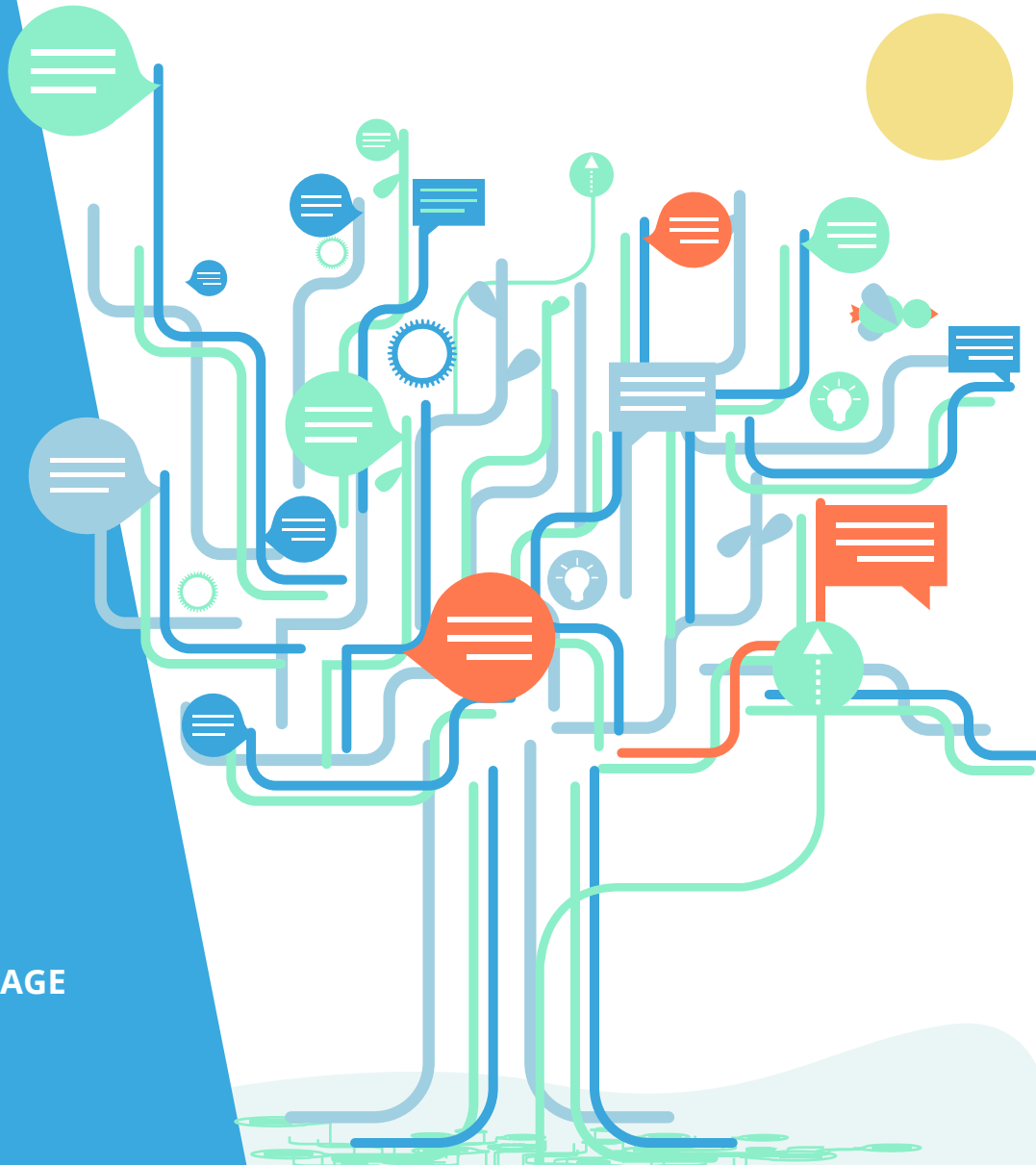






Goals

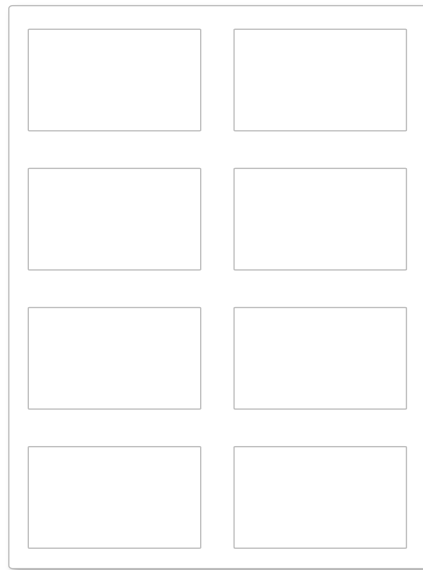
