

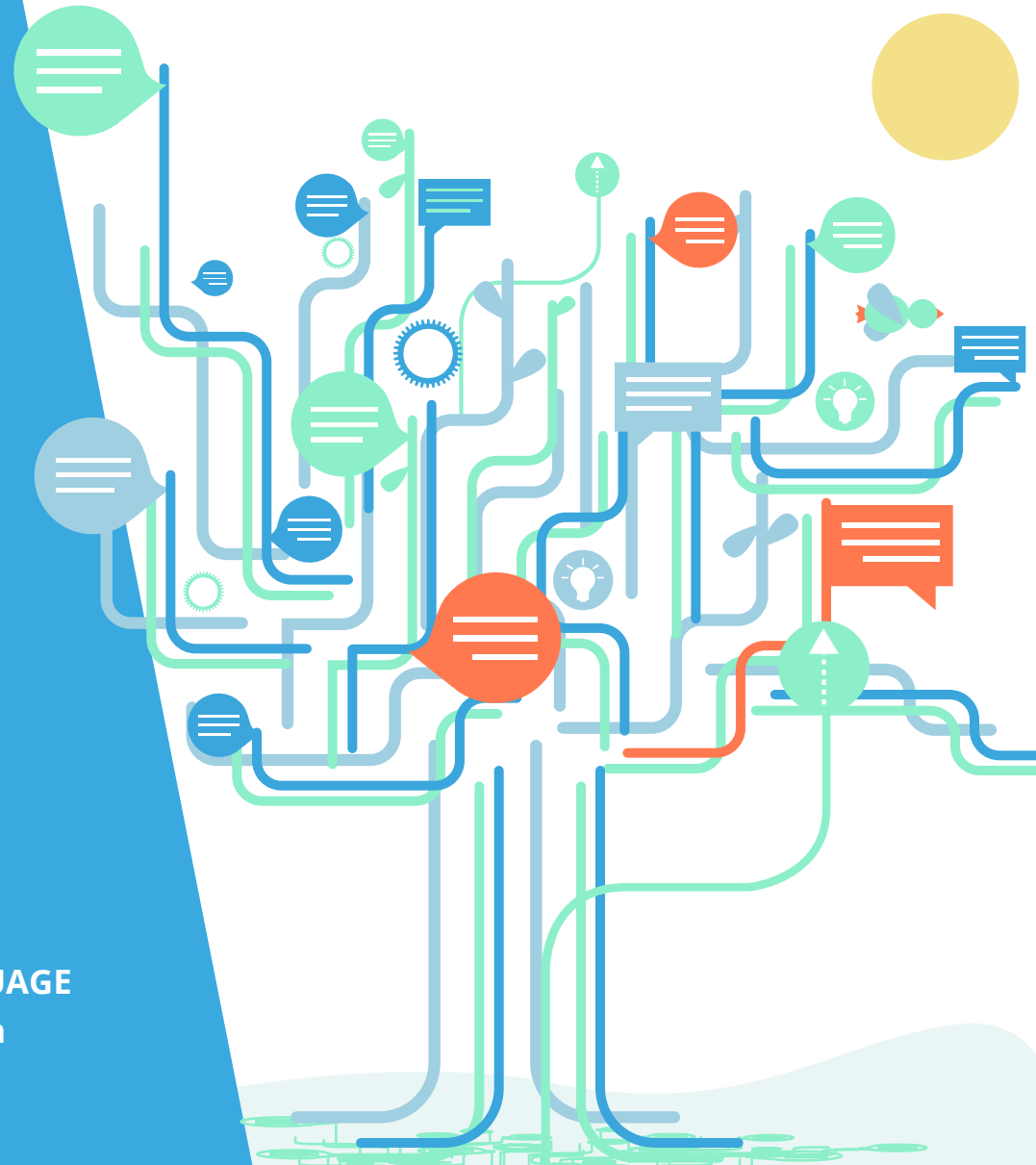

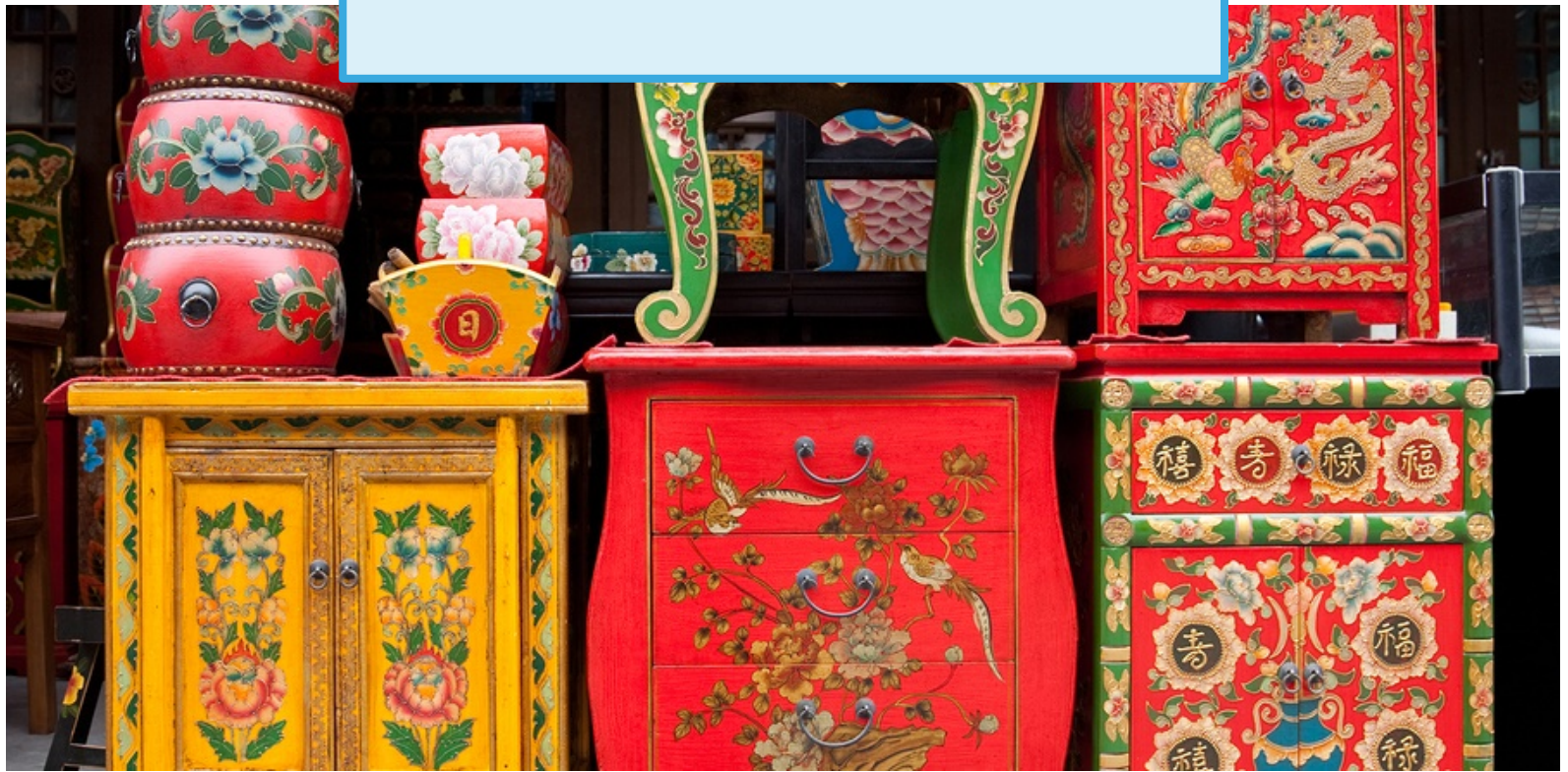
There are many different **stalls** in a market.
