

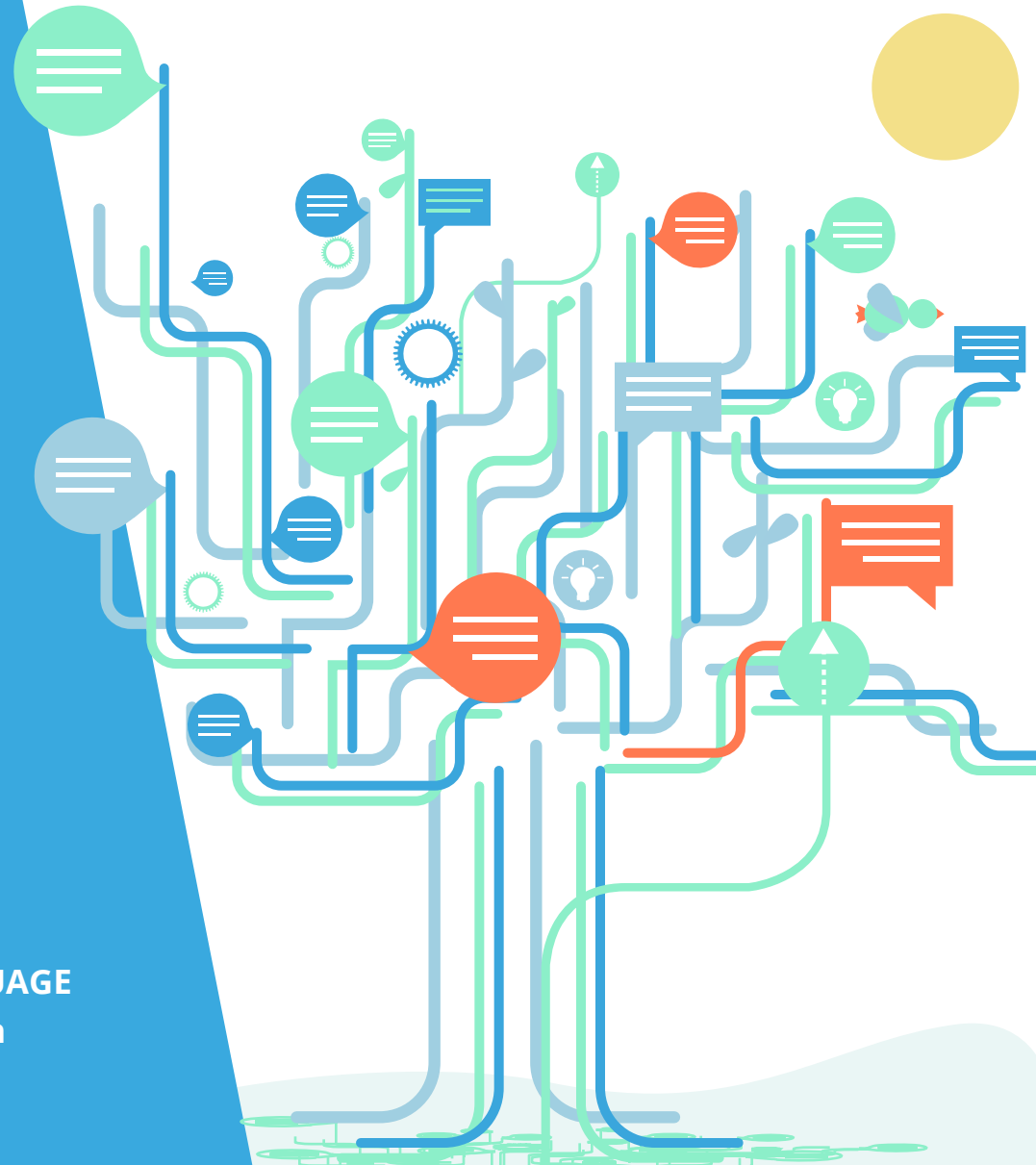






Goals

Buying a shirt

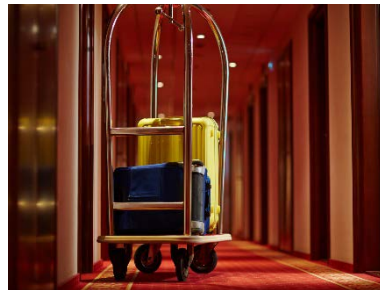

Finding a gift for Erin

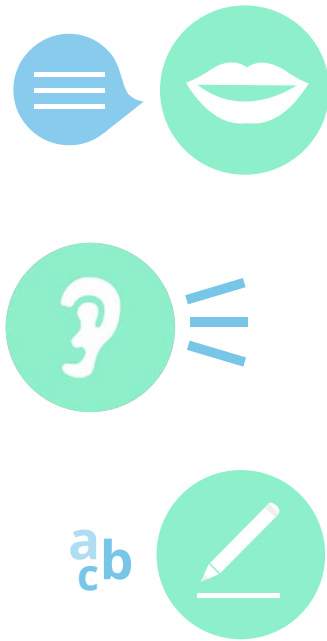

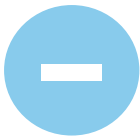

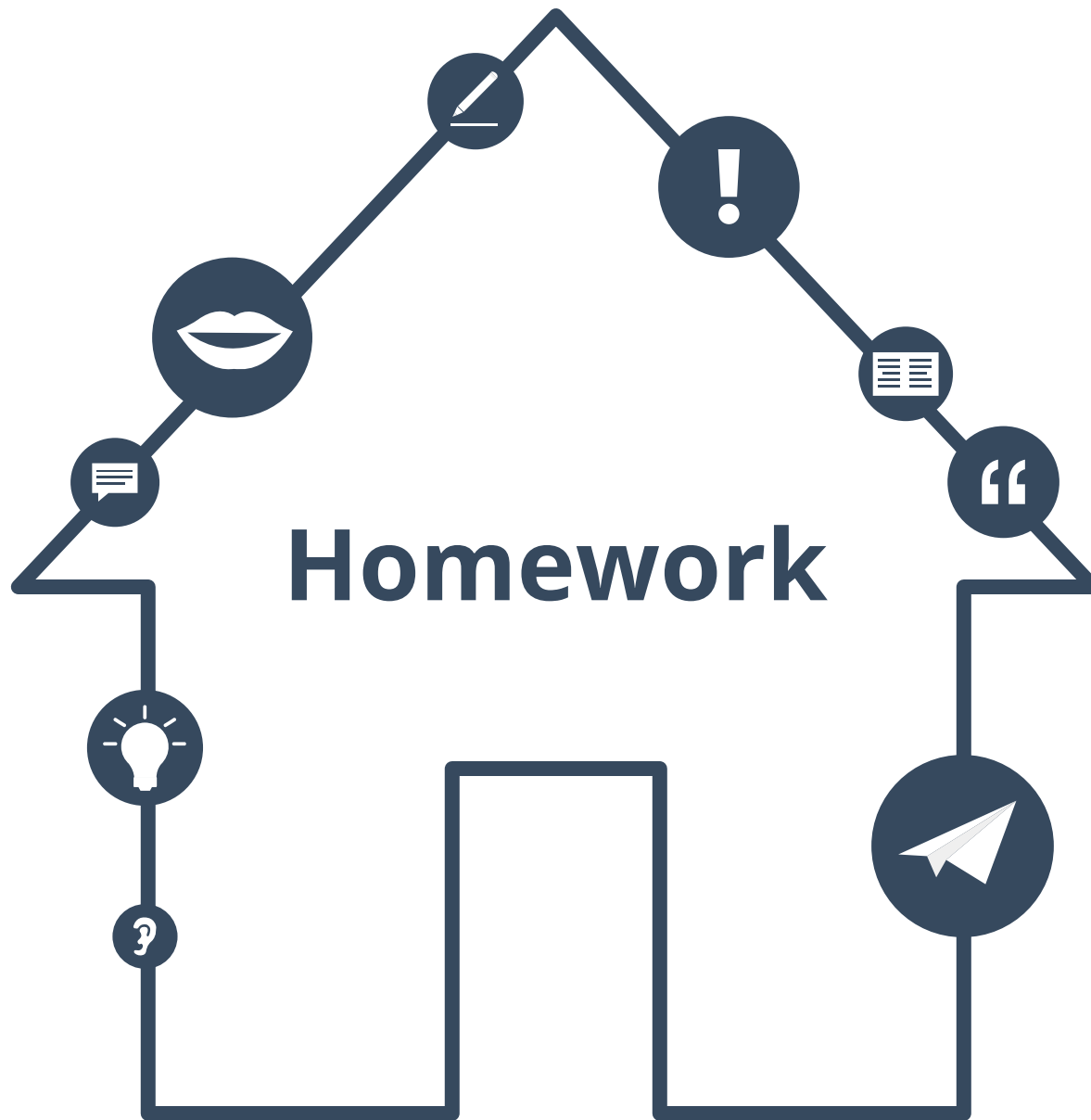
